LLED 433/434/387 Drama in Education (1 credit x 64hrs = \$1,966.91) (July 18 - 25) MTWRF - 12:00 PM - 5:00 PM, S - 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM

The course is interactive and explores ways to integrate drama into classroom teaching. A variety of drama strategies will be introduced to participants. Readings in the field will be part of the course requirement along with written assignments related to drama education.

Applicants must have a minimum of a recognized master's degree with relevant teaching experience and academic expertise in drama. Applicants for this position should have experience in the K – 12 school system. They should be familiar with the system's structure and services, with the various stakeholder groups and with authorities involved in the provision of education in British Columbia. Duties for this 1 credit position include teaching and marking assignments. Expertise and practical experience in applied theatre and drama teaching is critical, with experience with k-12 teachers.
